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C. Policy on Harassment and Discrimination

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D. Policy with Respect to AIDS

1. A student who is diagnosed with AIDS or HIV (i.e., a student who is HIV positive) shall be treated as a student with a disability under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and shall be eligible for all the accommodations and services available to students with disabilities.
2. A student who is diagnosed with AIDS or HIV shall be eligible for all the accommodations and services available to students with disabilities, including but not limited to:
 - a. Extended time for examinations and quizzes;
 - b. Access to a quiet place to study or take examinations;
 - c. Access to a computer or other assistive technology;
 - d. Access to a sign language interpreter or other communication services;
 - e. Access to a reader or scribe;
 - f. Access to a note taker;
 - g. Access to a personal care attendant;
 - h. Access to a wheelchair or other mobility device;
 - i. Access to a parking space or other transportation services;
 - j. Access to a sign language interpreter or other communication services;
